Dear Parents/Guardians,

DCSD is committed to implementing equitable practices to increase access to advanced/gifted learning opportunities. Based on state and national recommendations and requirements, we implement Universal Screening for students in 2nd grade (February).

2nd Grade Universal Screen

As part of this process, **ALL** students in 2nd grade not identified for gifted programming will take the **Cognitive Abilities Test** (**CogAT**) the week of February 7th, 2023. This assessment indicates the level and pattern of cognitive development of a student in comparison to grade and age mates. These general reasoning abilities, which start developing at birth and continue through early adulthood, are influenced by experiences gained both in and out of school.

If your child is already identified for gifted programming, they will not participate in this universal screen testing. Your Gifted Education Facilitator will contact you directly with information about this process. Kindergarten/ 1st Grade Gifted Identification Referral Testing

- If your child is in K or 1st grade and you believe he/she needs evaluation for Gifted Identification and Services, you may refer your child for testing by initiating the Gifted Identification Process.
- NOTE: Requesting this assessment automatically initiates the process to evaluate for Gifted Identification.
- Please request CogAT testing for your child by completing the **Referral for Gifted Identification** linked <u>HERE</u>.
- Upon receipt of this form the Gifted Education Facilitator will connect with you to discuss next steps in the gifted identification process.

OPEN TO ALL FRANKTOWN STUDENTS (GRADES K - 5) Projects Due: Morning, Tuesday, February 21, 2023

Classroom Viewing: Wednesday, February 22, 2023

Family & Public Viewing (and judging for grades 4 & 5):

Thursday evening, February 23, 2023

Minimum Project Requirements:

K –1: Each participating student and his/her parents investigate a science topic together.

A simple experiment should be done as part of the investigation. Together, each participating student and his/her parents make a display showing what they learned. Each participant will receive a Participation Ribbon.

2-3: Each participating student investigates a science topic with parental assistance (meaning parental involvement is appropriate; however, students should do as much of the work as is both possible and practical). It is preferred that an experiment be done as part of the investigation, though an experiment is not required. With parental assistance, each participating student makes a display showing what he/she did and learned. Each participant will receive a Participation Ribbon.

4 –5: <u>Each participating student investigates a science topic.</u> An experiment <u>must</u> be done as part of the investigation. Each participating student must follow directions for completing his/her investigation. Each participating student makes a display showing what he/she did and learned. A bibliography of two or more resources that tells from where each participating student found information that helped

him/her design the experiment and make a hypothesis MUST be included as part of an abstract or display board. The participating student MAY submit a written research paper that summarizes the research done for the project or on a topic related to his/her investigation. (Parental involvement, for fourth and fifth grade investigations should be minimal. Fourth and fifth grade students must plan and complete their own investigations, displays, and reports. A parent may only supervise and critique his/her child's work for safety; age appropriateness; validity and accuracy of process, results, and conclusions; and timely completion.)
Each participant will receive a Participation Ribbon. Medals will be given to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in each grade- 4th and 5th.

Registration Deadline:

To participate in the Franktown Elementary School Science Fair, <u>students must</u> <u>complete and submit a</u> <u>PROJECT REGISTRATION FORM by February 10.</u> A copy of the registration form is attached to this packet.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Projects that involve humans and/or vertebrate animals will <u>NOT</u> be permitted unless a "Human/Vertebrate Animal Protocol Form" is completed and approved <u>prior</u> to beginning the experiment. Please contact Mrs. Markel to secure "Human/Vertebrate Animal Protocol Form," if needed. <u>Application</u>

Dear Franktown Families,

We wanted to send a quick communication out on the importance of school attendance. AM drop off procedures: Pull along the curb to let students out, <u>please use the entire length of the curb</u>. We have staff along the curb that will help your student if needed. <u>Alternatively</u>, park in a parking spot and walk your student from the parking lot using the crosswalk. Please do not allow your student to walk from a parking spot into school without you present.

PM pick up procedures: Pull along the curb <u>as far forward or north as possible</u>. If there is not enough room at the curb, form a line and wait to pull forward. We will help load your student from the curbside only. Please do not use the second lane of through traffic for loading. <u>Or</u> Park in a parking spot and **walk to the sidewalk** and take your child back to the car with you using the crosswalk.
