Hello Franktown Community,

I wanted to share some clarification regarding some misinformation in the 2022 General Election Tabor Book or the "Blue Book" you may have received in the mail regarding 5A and 5B.

At the October 11 Board of Education meeting, Superintendent Kane addressed some misinformation about the Mill Levy Override (5A) and Bond (5B) that was published in the 2022 General Election Tabor Book (sometimes referred to as the "Blue Book").

Everything published in the Tabor Book (whether pro or con) is submitted by citizens and must be printed as submitted. Unfortunately, there is no fact-checking process prior to publication.

Dear Franktown Families,

We wanted to send a quick communication out on the importance of school attendance. 

On the other hand, were you not thrilled with the picture you had taken? That is ok, just come to school on the 25th dressed and ready for a picture.


If you liked the picture and have not ordered your package, please do so by Friday, October 28th. This is the deadline for round 1 pictures.



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Student Drop-Off and
Pick-Up Area

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AM drop off procedures: Pull along the curb to let students out, please use the entire length of the curb. We have staff along the curb that will help your student if needed. Alternatively, park in a parking spot and walk your student from the parking lot using the crosswalk. Please do not allow your student to walk from a parking spot into school without you present.

PM pick up procedures: Pull along the curb <u>as far forward or north as possible</u>. If there is not enough room at the curb, form a line and wait to pull forward. We will help load your student from the curbside only. Please do not use the second lane of through traffic for loading. <u>Or</u> Park in a parking spot and **walk to the sidewalk** and take your child back to the car with you using the crosswalk.

We encourage all families that can, ride the school bus. This will help with our long lines during drop off and pick up. If you need assistance with getting a bus route set up, please contact the front office. Please ride the bus!
